

- Behavioral Support Center Area designated to provide sensory resources for staff to program success.

Social Clubs, Special Events, Trips and Leisure Education

Social Clubs had 1054 registrations and 160 individuals across six different clubs with 16 clubs each.

Leisure Education had 719 students in 52 classrooms among 20 different schools experience leisure activities within a community setting among all member park districts.

Trips: 27 individuals were able to experience an overnight vacation among peers in either Boston, Massachusetts or Starved Rock, Illinois.

Inclusion Highlight



1:1 Programming

Snoezelen Sensory Therapy within four rooms in Hanover Park, Rolling Meadows, Mt. Prospect, and Wheeling. Community Sensory Garden in Hanover Park, Accessible Dream Lab in Rolling Meadows, and Club Wellness in Mt. Prospect.

Over 50 Registrations and 25 individual participants who live within 9 of the 17 park districts engaged in 1:1 programming with Full-Time CTRS. Each participant worked to accomplish individualized goals such as independence, socialization, taking turns, and adapting to change and transitions.



1:1 Swim Lessons



1:1 Swim Lessons increase by **44%** with an addition of another night to accommodate the waiting list. Swim lessons are held in Arlington Heights, Elk Grove, Wheeling and Streamwood Park Districts for the regional programming approach.

In 2023 1:1 Swim Lessons had over 100 registrations and 57 individual participants who reside in 11 of the 17 park districts.


416 Athletic Registrations

The Summer Camp Breakdown

- 3 Cooperative camps with school district 15 and 54 to provide recreation after the extended school year program (ESY)
- 5 8 week camps, and 4 -4 week camps utilized 3 schools, 2 churches and 3 park district facilities -Palatine, Rolling Meadows and Bartlett Park Districts and River Trails.

 2 Specialty Camps ran for 4 weeks at NSSEO's Kirk School for campers with extensive personal care and medical needs. Another camp ran at NSSEO's Sunrise Lake Outdoor Education Center for campers who are looking for outdoor recreation adventurous opportunities.





Technology

- Hired an IT Manager under an SGA with the Rolling Meadows Park District.

2024 Goals



Financial Management

- Utilize budget snapshot at various meetings and outreach events throughout the year to be transparent and educate stakeholders on the agency's revenue sources and expenses.
- Develop fee policy and procedure to streamline fees across all programs and services to maintain a sustainable profit loss margin.
- Create a procedural manual that outlines the processes and steps to support all financial aspects of the agency.
- Create a maintenance and replacement plan for all equipment and supplies within programming spaces and specialty rooms.

Operational Excellence

- Assess and evaluate programs to determine the domain category and which programs will follow a formalized APIED process implemented by a CTRS.
- Create a monthly timeline to highlight full time staff achievements / recognitions on social media platforms for professional collogues, families, stakeholders, and member districts.
- Continue to develop and bring awareness to the high school DSP program collaboratively with outside agencies.

Operational Excellence

- Host three open house registration nights within the six regions to allow families to ask about programs and services and be able to register with assistance.
- Configure and evaluate the online registration software within Civi CRM and investigate adding an option to request scholarships within online registration.

Promoting Leadership

- Create materials to educate current legislators who represent the service area on NWSRA programs and services including current trends in the field of Therapeutic Recreation.
- Hold quarterly Townhall Meetings virtually to educate stakeholders and create awareness on NWSRA programs and services.

Promoting Leadership

- Develop training manuals and monthly timelines for each position and department within the agency to assist with internal promotions through succession planning.
- Hold biannual hybrid trainings for Member Park District
 employees to learn more about the Americans with Disabilities
 Act, the partnership between member districts and NWSRA
 and the benefits of being a part of an SRA for the community.

Outstanding Service

- Research, design and assess all resources needed for PURSUIT Plus within the current PURSUIT program in collaboration with Clearbrook.
- Create a presentation on the PURSUIT program regarding the history, growth and future that includes expansion to PURSUIT Plus and a vocational component to promote meaningful job opportunities and open up available days for clients on the waitlist.
- Plan and implement three of the programs in a one-day trial / teaser program to highlight the therapeutic outcomes and certifications and trainings staff need to uphold within each specialty area.
- Implement the transportation pick up/drop off locations across all programming to represent the new hub system.
