Dear Ms. Julison:

The Wheeling Park District hereby requests approval from the Northwest Special Recreation Association Board of Directors for expenditures paid by the Park District for fitness equipment at its Fitness Center located in its Community Recreation Center in Wheeling, Illinois.

The Wheeling Park District's membership demographic includes many individuals with special needs, and an increasingly aging population. Over the last several years, this demographic has sought expanded wellness and fitness opportunities that this equipment will provide. Additionally, staff anticipates that in 2009, programs will be adopted specifically to meet the needs of the Northwest Special Recreation Association.

In 2008, Park District staff, recognizing this need, solicited bids from a number of qualified vendors. A decision was made to acquire equipment from Life Fitness and work closely with Life Fitness in setting up the redesign of the center to ensure that adequate space was available to any participant interested in using the equipment listed below. The Park District was confident that Life Fitness (and its partner, Hammer Strength) would be an ideal vendor, based on the NWSRA memo from Jim Wiseman, Superintendent of Recreation.

The Wheeling Park District believes strongly that the Special Recreation Levy was designed exactly for this.

Repairs to the units are costly, and equipment is often not available for use by members. Strength equipment was also chipped and, in many cases, unusable. As is indicated above, the District is offsetting its request by those items that it was able to trade in.

The Wheeling Park District requests approval by the NWSRA Board to provide support for purchasing this equipment to better serve those individuals with special needs. The requested equipment provides a safe way for members with disabilities to improve their fitness level, strength, and balance, and most importantly, their quality of life.



The Bartlett Park District hereby notifies and requests approval from the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay for the cost of the following ADA improvements:


1. **Bartlett Station Park Development.** At this new one-acre park we have constructed a new playground and picnic area to include an accessible concrete pathway connecting to an existing accessible public sidewalk. A plan is attached to show the layout of this park development. The accessible concrete walk leads to an accessible picnic table and seating area and to a concrete ramp leading into the engineered wood fiber safety surfacing. The playground was designed with accessible features consisting of a transfer platform to the play structure that has slides and play panels, and there are several accessible ground level play stations. Twenty percent (20%) of the construction costs were assigned to the Special Recreation Budget.
 - a. The construction costs of the park were: \$98,488.70
 - b. The accessible costs for this project were: **\$19,697.74**

2. **ADA Accessibility Assessment of Facilities and Property.** The Bartlett Park District has hired Recreation Accessibility Consultants to complete an independent ADA audit of twenty-eight (28) parks and seven (7) facilities. The cost for this audit is **\$25,873.00.**

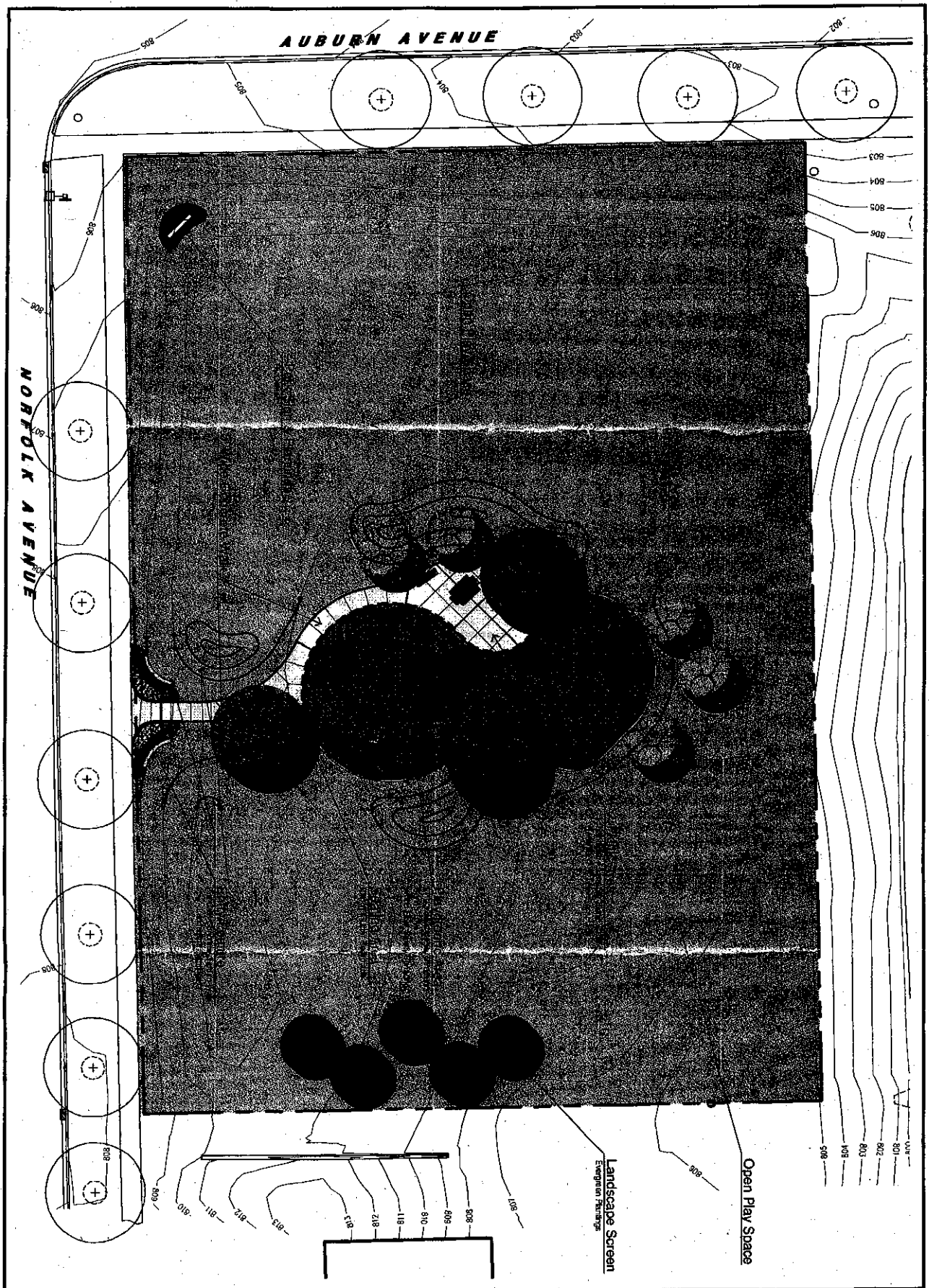
Total costs for the playground development and ADA audit equals

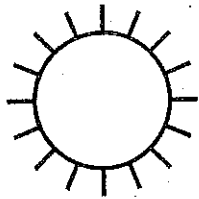

Dear Ms. Julison,

The HEPD / Poplar Creek Country Club is currently replacing and resurfacing existing golf cart paths at Poplar Creek Country Club. As part of that project, the district is replacing specific deteriorated asphalt paths and resurfacing the majority of the paths to ensure the accessibility of the golf course for all individuals. These paths are designed and built to accommodate our ADA approved EZGO Single riding golf cart. At this time, the HEPD hereby requests approval from the NWSRA Board of Directors for the following expenditures to be paid from the Park District's Special Recreation Levy.

- Replace 44 lineal feet of accessible 8 ft. wide path
The district is requesting reimbursement for only 5ft of the path cross section replacement to ensure access for PCCC's ADA accessible golf cart.
5 ft. X 44 lineal feet = 220 sq. ft.

Bid cost for this work	\$1.50 sq. ft.
220 sq. ft. x \$1.50 =	\$330.00

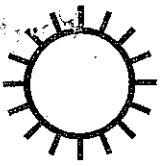

The Hoffman Estates Park District hereby requests approval from the Northwest Special Recreation Association Board of Directors for expenditures paid by the Park District for improvements made at Prairie Stone™ Sports and Wellness Center (PSS&WC) located in Hoffman Estates, IL.

As you know, at PSS&WC, we serve many members with special needs. There are several members who are wheelchair bound who work out at here. We have welcomed members from NWSRA with Down's Syndrome and other developmental delays. PSS&WC is also a host site for various groups from different organizations that work with developmentally delayed individuals (i.e., NWSRA, Little City Foundation of Palatine, Rehabilitative Institute of Chicago, Alexian Brother's Hospital) as well.

PSS&WC, in conjunction with Alexian Brother's Hospital, has developed the "Fit Club" program for patients who are undergoing cancer treatment so that these people can workout together at a designated time, providing a support system. Athletico Physical Therapy currently leases space within PSS&WC and works closely with the Personal Training/Fitness Supervisor to transition their patients from a physical therapy setting to the fitness setting safely.

The equipment purchased with the funds allocated through last year's Special Recreation Levy has been greatly appreciated by our members with special needs. Angie Picchi, a young woman with Down's Syndrome and NWSRA participant, continues to work weekly with a PSS&WC personal trainer as part of her training as a figure skater with the Special Olympics. Our cardio pieces help her maintain a healthy weight and the FreeMotion pieces have helped her gain functional strength and balance. Her goal is to go to Nationals this year. Another member, Ray West, comes to PSS&WC to exercise 2-3 times per week. Because he is in a wheelchair due to an auto accident, he finds that our ADA approved equipment allows him to continue to improve his strength and cardiovascular fitness level. These are just two examples of many individuals who have benefitted from the equipment purchased last year through the Special Recreation Fund. Other individuals representing various special needs populations that are currently utilizing PSS&WC include those with diabetes, obesity, cardiovascular disease, degenerative disc disease, hip/knee replacements, osteoarthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, fibromyalgia, lupus, multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's, and Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS).

Our current inventory of treadmills, cross-trainers and stationary bicycles does not sufficiently meet the needs and/or physical requirements of our facility users with varying disabilities. Many of these pieces are original to our facility and are utilized at a high volume. Subsequently, these pieces are in need of frequent repair and have also become out-dated. The newer models of LifeFitness treadmills, bikes and crosstrainers are more ergonomically correct, the action is smoother and, in the case of the treadmills, will provide greater shock absorption. These features are important for all users, but especially so for users with orthopedic issues. Similarly, the Nautilus step mill trainers are in need of replacement due to frequent repair as well as leaking oil. This piece of equipment utilizes the same stair-climbing motion that is required in daily living, making the exercise highly functional especially for people who are transitioning out of physical therapy due to knee or hip injury. The replacement of many of our cardio equipment is therefore necessary at this time.

We are looking to add one additional Cybex Arc Trainer to our floor. The Arc Trainers can provide an excellent cardiovascular workout without requiring a large amount of knee flexion. This makes it a very valuable piece of equipment to members who are looking for a way to challenge their cardiovascular systems but often are limited because of the diminished range of motion they have in their knees due to injuries, arthritis or overuse.

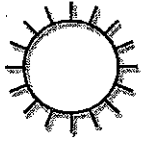
The LifeFitness Summit Trainer is a newer piece. The Summit Trainer utilizes a climbing, scaling motion with an adjustable incline that allows for comfort if a user has a limited range of knee or hip flexion. It's dual arm action also provides balance training for the user. Unique to the Summit Trainer is it's stride length that is not set at a fixed measure, but adjusts to the stride length of the rider. This allows each individual who uses this piece to work within a safe and comfortable range of motion.

The equipment we are considering for purchase this year is all ADA approved so that individuals with many types of disabilities will benefit. These pieces provide a safe way for members with disabilities to improve their fitness level, their strength and their balance thus improving their quality of life. Due to the needs of our current members, the Hoffman Estates Park District respectfully requests your approval of the purchase of the equipment described above.

The Hoffman Estates Park District utilizes the Fiberflex system as a safety surface under our playground equipment. The Fiberflex system meets or exceeds the Playground Surfacing Guidelines of the U.S. Consumer Safety Commission, ASTM standard F1292-91 and ADA.

Playgrounds scheduled for resurfacing in 2008 are Canterbury, Highpoint (MacArthur), Huntington, Willow, Willow Tot, Hunters Ridge East, and Cottonwood.

Each park requires 120 cubic yards of surface at \$13.05 per cubic yard or \$1,566.00 per playground.

The total cost of safety surface for all parks is \$10,962.00 ✓

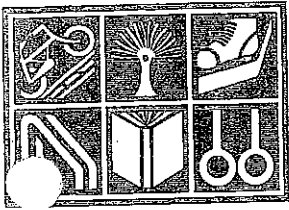

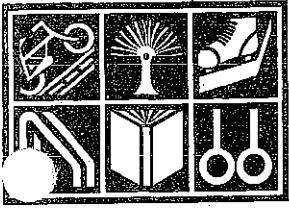



Dear Ms. Julison:

The Bartlett Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay for the cost of the following ADA improvements:

1. **Coyote Junction Park Development.** At this new two-acre park, accessible pathways were constructed that connect to existing accessible multi-use pathways, allowing three routes for park users to enter the park. A plan is attached (the small shelter and pad are shown but were not constructed). The accessible paths lead to an accessible picnic area pad and table and to a concrete ramp accessing the engineered wood fiber safety surfacing. The playground was designed with accessible features that incorporate transfer platforms to two play structures that have slides, a horizontal net climber and various play stations. Several other accessible play stations are located at ground level along with an inclusive swing. Twenty percent of the construction costs were assigned to the Special Recreation Budget.
 - a. The construction costs of the park were \$151,953.00.
 - b. The accessible costs for this project were **\$30,393.00.**

2. **Multi-use Asphalt Pathway Overlay.** Approximately 1,120' of seven foot wide multi-use pathway was overlaid with 1-1/2 " of asphalt. Two feet of the seven foot width were assigned to the Special Recreation Budget.
 - a. Overlay costs were \$10,000.
 - b. The accessible portion of the path was **\$2,857.00.**


3. **Community Center Elevator Maintenance.** The elevator at the Bartlett Community Center accesses all four levels of the facility, including the physical therapy center, the health club, indoor aquatics and indoor track. Seventy-five percent of the costs were assigned to Special Recreation Budget.
 - a. The regularly scheduled elevator maintenance at the Community Center was \$1,019.00.
 - b. The accessible cost for this maintenance was **\$764.00**

4. **Community Center Accessible Entrances.** The Community Center has push pad operated door openers for the exterior and lobby doors at the north and south entrances; a total of four accessible door operators.
 - a. Three of these door operators were repaired this year for a cost of \$3,600.
 - b. The accessible cost for this maintenance was **\$3,600.**

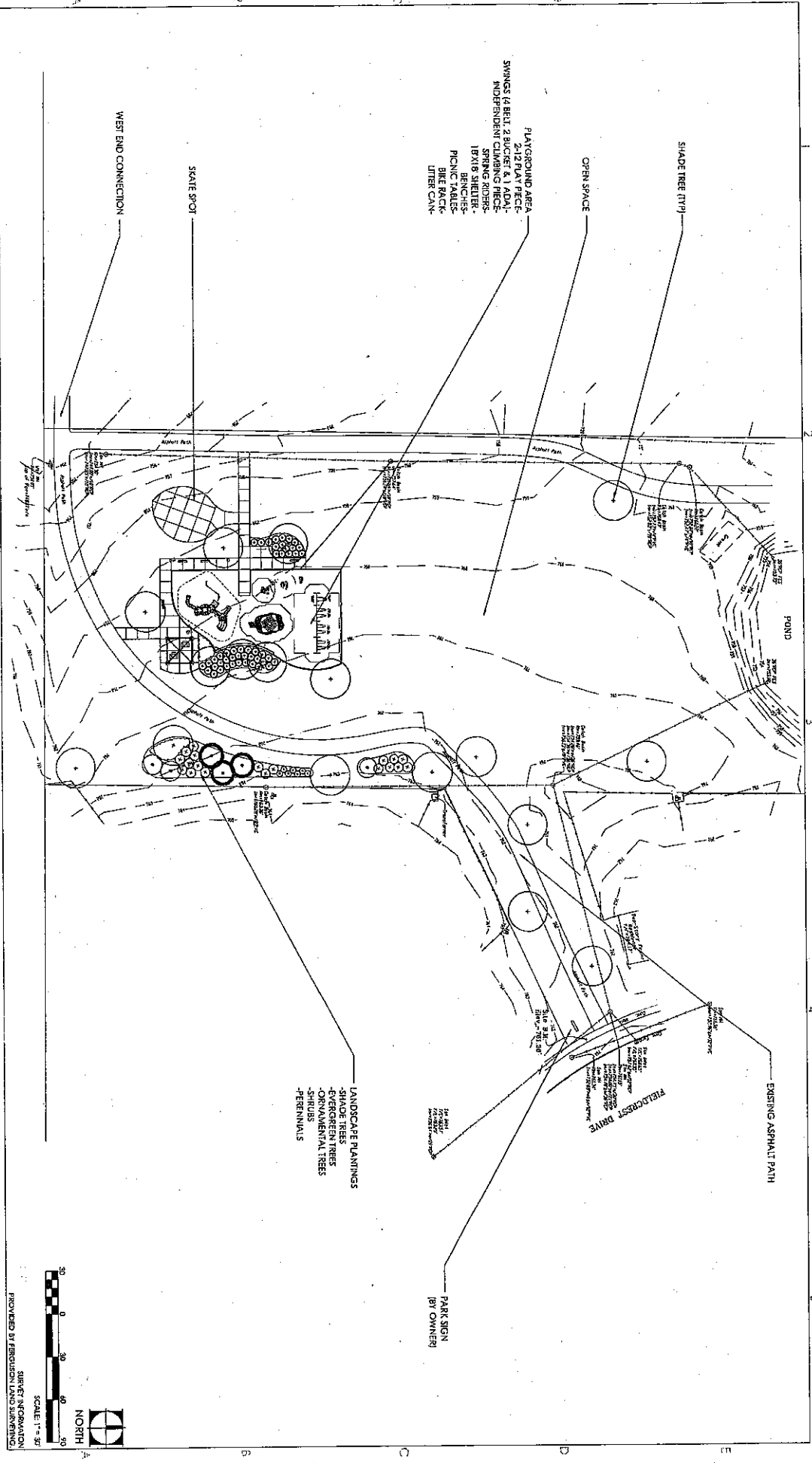





Twin Lakes Recreation Area – 2007 Asphalt Improvements

Project Objective: The existing fishing piers at Twin Lakes Recreation Area are ADA compliant, but there was no asphalt path connecting them. In the site assessment of this area the project engineer measured slope angles of the existing path and concluded that the asphalt path needed to be overlaid to meet ADA slope specifications.

- A. Two new asphalt paths to fishing piers:** There was 128 sq/yd of soil excavated and 110 sq/yd of asphalt material added. The asphalt paths measure 6'x 100' and 6'x 65' liner feet respectfully.
- B. Two new park benches and pads near fishing piers:** The contractor installed (2) 6'x 8' asphalt paths along the side of each path to look out over the water. The bench pads measured 11 sq/yd and can accommodate a wheel chair.
- C. Additional asphalt for path to boat dock area:** This walking path was poorly sloped and additional asphalt was added to raise/level the surface to meet ADA requirements. The asphalt path measured 6'x 1000' liner feet and 68 tons of additional asphalt was needed to level the paths slope.
- D. Two new park benches and pads for boat dock area:** The contractor installed (2) 6'x 8' asphalt paths along the side of each path to look out over the water. The bench pads measured 11 sq/yd and can accommodate a wheel chair.

Asphalt Cost Breakdown:

- (A – B)** New asphalt paths with bench pads for fishing piers = \$4,305.92
- (C – D)** Additional asphalt for boat dock path w/bench pads = \$5,780.00

All projects listed above and described below were completed in 2007.

Mather Park – Park Renovation

The entire project consisted of a complete renovation of the existing baseball field and replacement of two (2) existing tennis courts with one (1) new tennis court and one (1) new basketball court. The existing conditions of the tennis court area and the baseball field did not allow for proper accessibility. In order to comply with ADA standards the project required extensive concrete work, including a ramped 5' wide walk to the basketball / tennis court and a long 5' wide concrete walk to the new baseball field. The walk to the baseball field also required extensive earthwork including culvert and fill work over an existing drainage swale. Please see enclosed site plan.

Fountain Square Park – Playground Replacement

The playgrounds at the Elk Grove Park District are replaced on a regular basis approximately every 13-15 years. As locations come up for replacement new equipment is reviewed and purchased based on a list of criteria. Included in this list is accessibility and meeting the ADA standards. We estimate 20% of the costs of the playground replacement project can be attributed to accessibility. This includes a percentage of the actual playground equipment, safety surface and concrete work for each playground. Please see enclosed site plans.

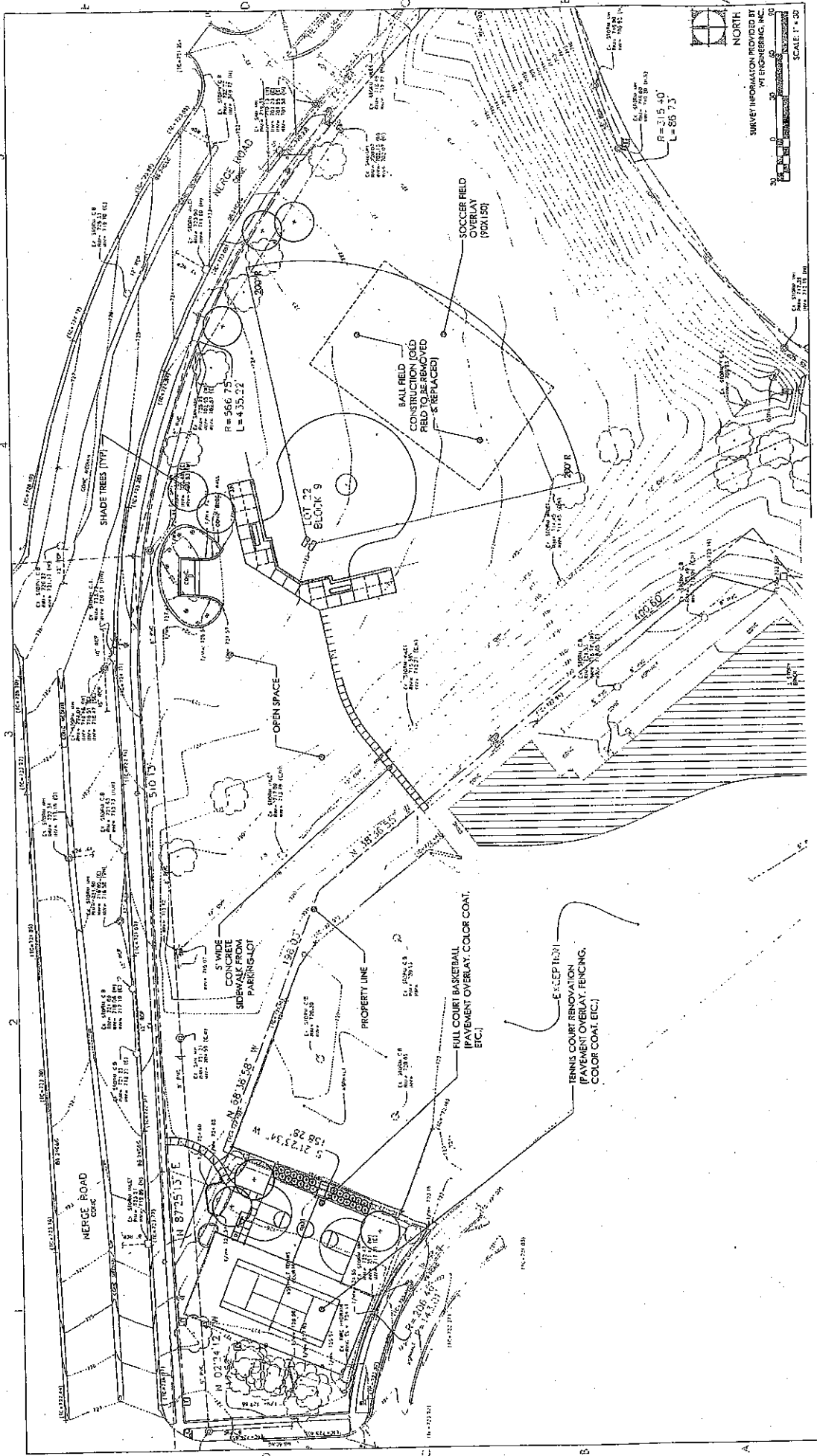

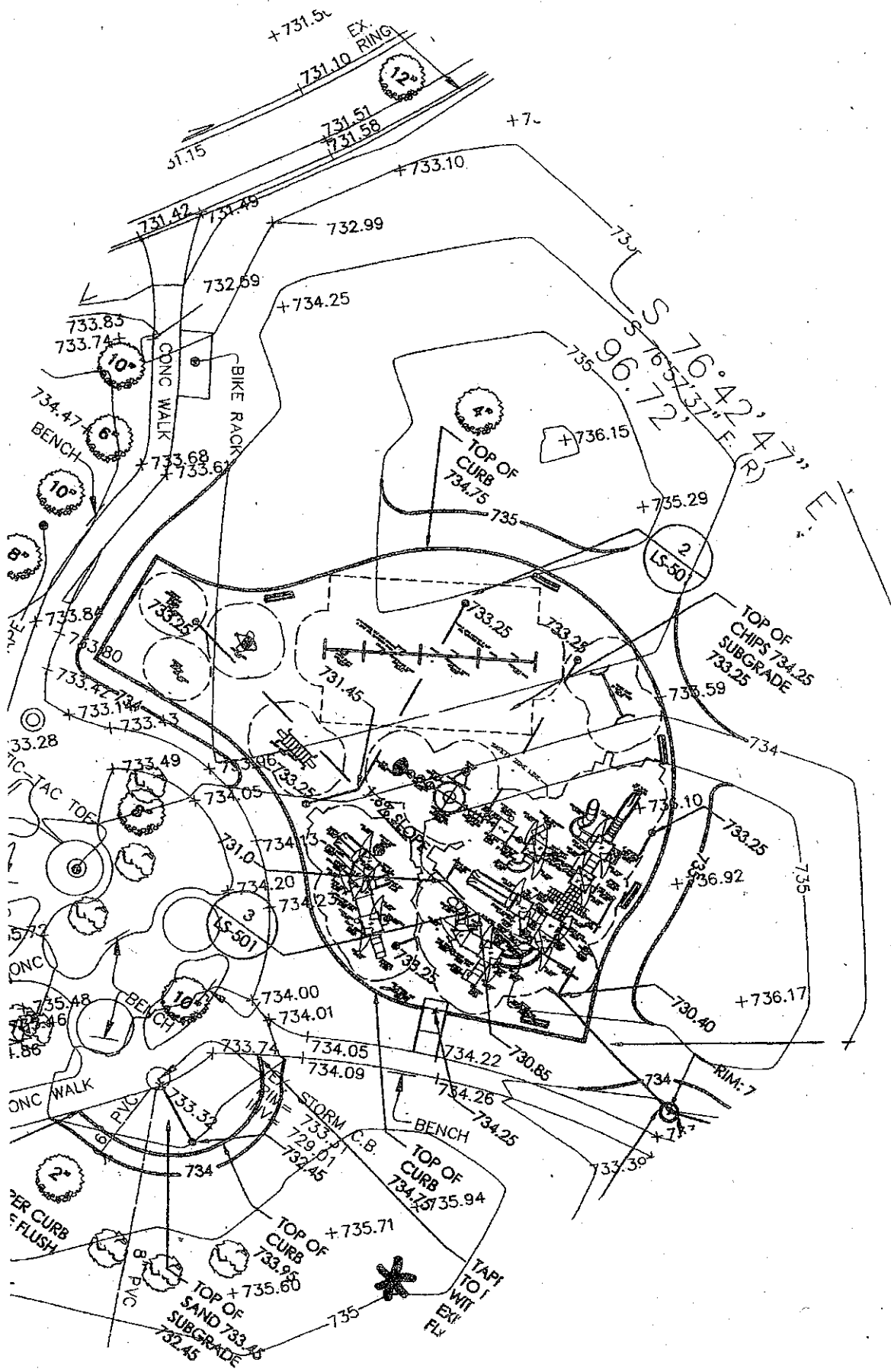

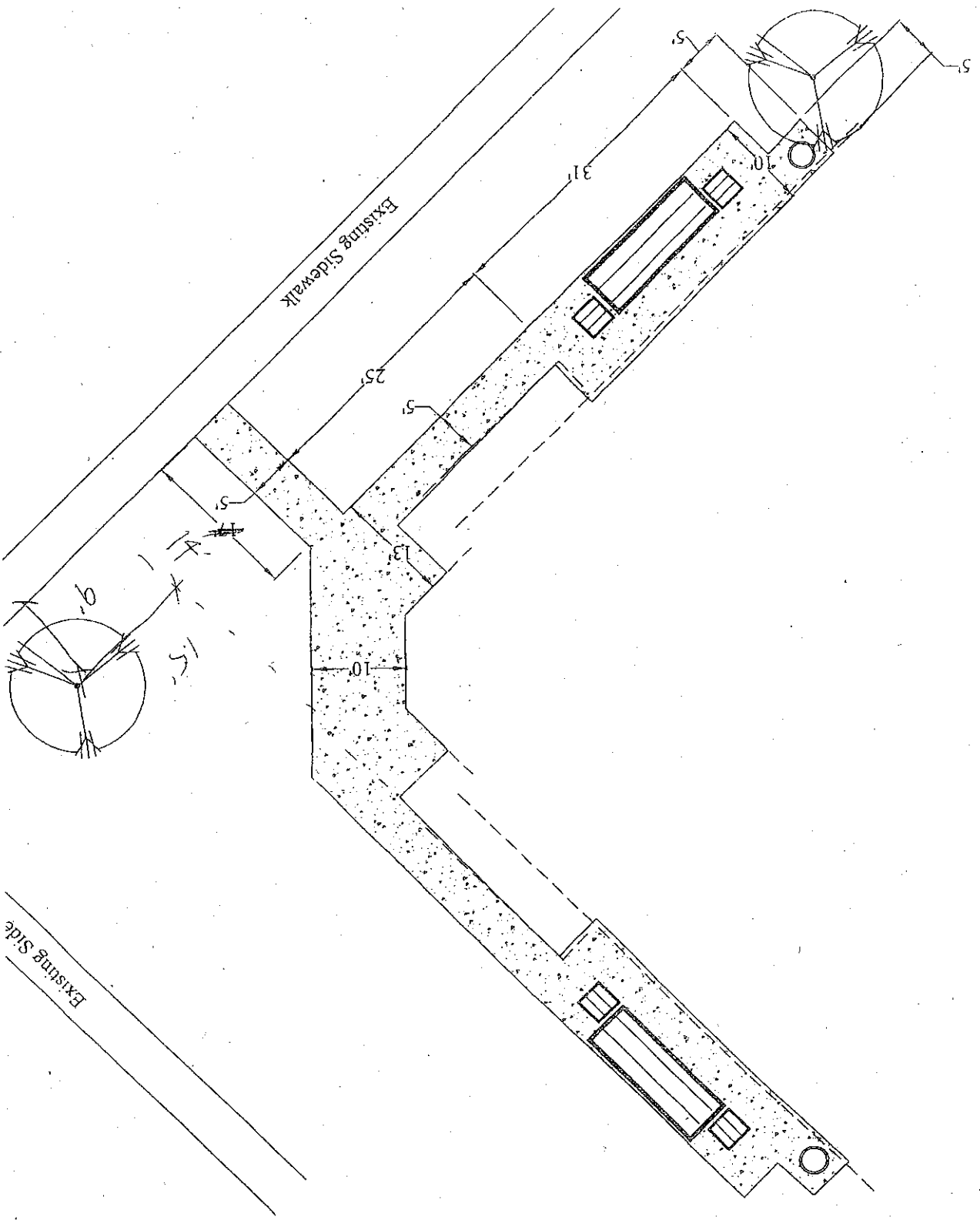
MATHER PARK - PARK RENOVATION

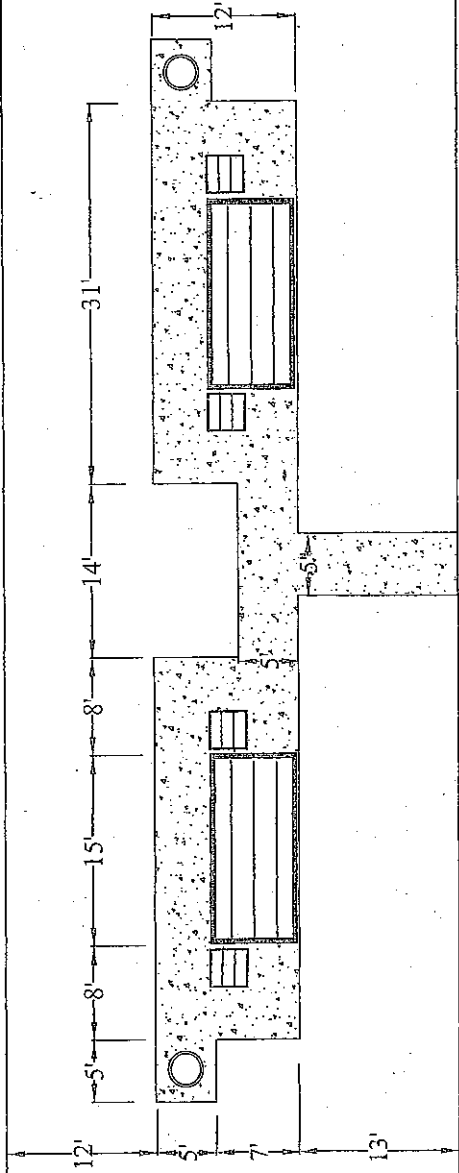




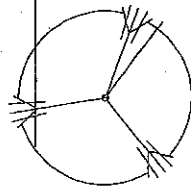
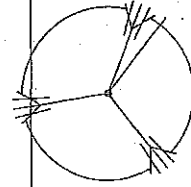
