

Pending availability, you will be contacted to set up an assessment and guardian meeting.



STEP 3

Complete a successful assessment.



STEP 4

Pending a successful assessment, you will be set for a trial/ pre-trial meeting at a PURSUIT location.



STEP 5

Complete a successful trial period and attend a post-trial meeting to determine acceptance into the PURSUIT program.



PURSUIT is designed to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities 21 years and older throughout the year by creating recreation and leisure opportunities, improving health and wellness, teaching life skills self advocacy, and community integration. PURSUIT is licensed by the Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities.

Program Time

Programming is from 9:30 am until 2:30 pm Monday - Friday

Admission

Continuous throughout the year, upon vacancies available

Eligibility

Participants must be at least 21 years old, have a disability, be able to function in a 1:4 ratio, and do not need assistance administering medications during program time.

Please note NWSRA offers Programs before and after PURSUIT.



Four Core Elements

Recreation & Leisure

- Developing gross and fine motor skills
- Experiencing cultural arts (dance, drama, arts and music)
- Participating in passive and active sporting activities
- Learning outdoor awareness

Skills & Self Advocacy

- Expanding communication skills
- Promoting human rights and self advocacy
- Enhancing socialization skills
- Developing technology skills

Community Integration

- Participating in local service projects
- Experiencing group outings and activities
- Exploring community resources
- Gaining vocational skills through volunteer experiences

Health & Wellness

- Setting and maintaining fitness goals
- Encouraging healthy eating habits
- Developing a positive body image
- Learning to cook nutritious snacks and meals
- Promoting a balanced lifestyle

Program Options Include

Participants commit to a pre-selected day and time for programs from the following:

- Monday Friday
- 1 5 days per week

- Cilents will be charged the program fees during their trial prior to acceptance.
- Clearbrook and NWSRA reserve the right to adjust fees.
- Fees are subject to change based on the annual budget.
- Residents have priority in application for the program.
- · Non-residents will be allowed to apply subject to availability.
- Clients utilizing 1:1 staffing at PURSUIT will be billed an additional fee per hour
- Clients utilizing waiver funding for program will be billed for in-program activities and community activities at different rates.

Transportation Fees

- Clients must be accepted into the program to be eligible for transportation.
- Pick up and drop off locations will be located in the NWSRA service area and determined by the Managers of Collaborative Services
- Transportation times may change based on enrollment and/or last minute facility changes.
- Transportation for non-resident clients will be based upon availability, after the needs of the resident clients have been met.
