Open House

This is an opportunity for parents and campers to share information & pick up the field trip shirt prior to the start of camp. More information will be e-mailed in early May.

Parent Handbook/Registration Confirmation

Parents/guardians are sent a parent handbook along with Camp confirmation of registration in early May. Parents are encouraged to read the Parent Handbook carefully to learn more about day camp procedures.

Brochure Distribution

Day camp brochure will be available online and mailed to all 2025 campers. The day camp brochure will be available as a hard copy at the NWSRA office. Please call the office if you are interested in being added to the Day Camp mailing list so that you receive a brochure next year.

Safety Vest Systems

Campers that require a harness system for transportation during summer day camp are required to provide their own safety vests. NWSRA and the commercial bus company do not provide the vests, but do provide the hook up system. Parents should contact their local school district prior to the end of the school year to request possible use of a safety vest over the summer or purchase their own vest.

INCLUSION SERVICES



WHAT IS **INCLUSION**?

At NWSRA and our member park districts, inclusion isn't just required; it's something we truly value. We believe individuals of all abilities deserve meaningful access to recreation and community programs. We work together to identify and provide reasonable modifications, ensuring successful participation for individuals with disabilities, at no additional cost.

HOW TO **REQUEST SUPPORT**

To request inclusion support, simply indicate your need for a reasonable modification during registration with your home park district by checking the ADA box, typically found on the registration form. After registering, the program supervisor will contact you to gather additional information and connect with NWSRA's Inclusion Coordinator who oversees that park district.

SUPPORT PROVIDED MAY INCLUDE:

- Adaptive Equipment
- Individualized Resources (behavioral plan, visual schedule, communication board, incentive charts, etc.)
- Facilitation of Personal Care Plans
- Placement of Inclusion Aide
- Coaching Member Park District Staff

WHY INCLUSION?

While many individuals achieve their recreation goals through NWSRA programs, others may thrive in their local park district activities. Inclusion is about creating opportunities for people with and without disabilities to participate together. Inclusive recreation helps individuals with disabilities build skills for life in an integrated community and just as importantly, it helps communities embrace and celebrate individual diversity.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration Procedures

Registration for programs can be completed online at nwsra.org/brochure or in person at NWSRA's Main Office. When registering for camp please be mindful of the ability group, age, and interests - as all camps are not appropriate for all individuals. All camps are on a first come first service basis. Regardless of the method, registration must be completed prior to the registration deadline. Registrations after the deadline will be automatically placed on a waitlist. As NWSRA staff are able to accommodate participants on the waitlist, registrants will be contacted. If programs are canceled or postponed, registered individuals will be notified by phone.

NWSRA PAYMENT PROCEDURES

NWSRA registrants have two options for making payments toward NWSRA programs. Registrants may either pay in full at the time of registration or select divided payments. If divided payments are selected, 10% of the Camp Program is due upon registration. The remaining 90% will be divided up into three equal payments outlined below. Registrants can elect to set up automatic credit card payments either online, or NWSRA's Main Office. Registrants may also elect to be billed for each payment. If this option is selected registrants may go into their online account and pay the due balance, or bring payment into NWSRA's Main Office. Please know that until the due balance is paid, an individual may not sign up for any additional programming as their account will have a past due balance.

Credit Card Processing Fees

Credit card processing fees will be applied to all transactions paid by credit card, whether online or at the NWSRA Main Office. NWSRA simply passes on the exact processing cost to registrants and does not mark up or generate revenue from these fees. To avoid these fees, payments may be made via cash or check by registering at the NWSRA Main Office.

REFUNDS AND CREDITS

Credits may be issued in the following circumstances:

- When NWSRA cancels a program
- When NWSRA determines a program is inappropriate for the participant
- In cases of prolonged illness (doctor's note required) or relocation
- If you are dissatisfied after attending the first program session, a credit can be requested before the second session. A transfer to another available program may also be requested
- If NWSRA cancels transportation for a program

Weather Cancellations

NWSRA uses discretion when deciding to cancel programs due to inclement weather. Credits are not issued for weather-related cancellations. If a session is canceled due to weather, NWSRA will attempt to reschedule one session per program when possible.

Credit Processing & Terms

- NWSRA reserves the right to withhold from credit for costs already incurred (tickets, rentals, deposits, already scheduled staff etc.)
- Credits are processed monthly
- If your account has an existing balance, any new credits will first be applied to that balance
- Credits remain valid for three years; after this period, unclaimed credits will be transferred to the State of Illinois in accordance with the State of Illinois Unclaimed Property Statute

Situations Not Eligible for Credits

- Missed classes due to personal reasons or scheduling conflicts
- Participants receiving financial assistance
- Additional weather cancellations beyond the first canceled session

Refunds

Refunds (as opposed to credits) are evaluated on a case-by-case basis. To request a refund, please contact our front office at (847) 392-2848. For questions about credits and or refunds please contact our front office.

Non-Residents

Non-residents may register after the registration deadline, as space allows, and will be subject to a 50% increase above the fee listed. Transportation is not available outside of the NWSRA service area. If space allows, non-residents will be contacted

Financial Assistance/Scholarships

Financial Assistance is available for those in need of assistance with day camp fees. Call the office or visit nwsra.org/brochure to obtain a Financial Assistance Application. Financial Assistance Applications are due upon registration deadline, submission at time of registration is preferred. Those requesting a scholarship are still required to pay the 10% day camp fee upfront. All Applications must be completed in its entirety to be considered.

Sibling Discount

Families with more than one camper registering for camp, may deduct \$50.00 for each additional camper.

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
