



The Summer Camp Breakdown

- **3 Cooperative camps** with school district 15 and 54 to provide recreation after the extended school year program (ESY)
- **5 - 9 week camps**
- **4 - 5 week camps**
 - Camps utilized 4 schools, 2 churches and 2 park district facilities - Rolling Meadows and Bartlett Park Districts.
- **2 Specialty Camps ran for 5 weeks.**
 - 1 tailored to campers with extensive personal care and medical needs.
 - 1 tailored to campers who are looking for outdoor recreation adventurous opportunities. This ran at NSSEO's Sunrise Lake Outdoor Education Center.


