Two ADA compliant restrooms at the Poplar Creek Country Club

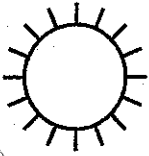



The Wheeling Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay the cost of the following improvements at the Community Recreation Center Preschool playground:


- Replacement of outdated play equipment with a new play structure, play panels, and installation of new, accessible, playground safety surface

Park District staff has determined that the ADA portion of these improvements should be \$14,550 of the play structure cost (total cost - \$24,500), \$3,000 of the ADA-accessible play panels (total cost - \$4,995), and \$9,760 of the ADA-accessible safety surface (total cost - \$9,760). All work was completed by Park District staff and the total cost of the improvements was \$43,790. Of that total, \$27,310 was determined to be the cost for the accessible portion of the playground. These improvements were completed in September 2010. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows:

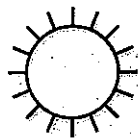
- Provides a play structure that exceeds ADA guidelines for accessibility

The Hoffman Estates Park District utilizes the Fiberflex system as a safety surface under our playground equipment. The Fiberflex system meets or exceeds the Playground Surfacing Guidelines of the U.S. Consumer Safety Commission, ASTM standard F1292-91 and ADA.

Play areas scheduled for resurfacing in 2010 are South Ridge Playground, Community Park Playground and Fitness Cluster, Sheffield Park Playground, Princeton Park Playground, and Highpoint Park Fitness Cluster.

The safety surface cost is \$14.20 per cubic yard; we are purchasing a total of 700 cubic yards.

The total cost of safety surface for all parks is \$9,940.00.

The Hoffman Estates Park District requests approval from the NWSRA Board of Directors that the above expenditures be paid from the Park District's Special Recreation Levy.



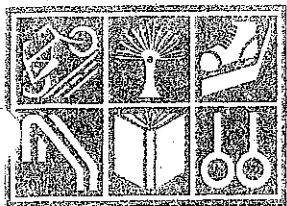



#### Centennial Park- ADA Access to Ballfields

These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides an accessible path around the park, (2) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, (3) provides an accessible path to the ball fields, (4) provides accessible bleachers and benches, and (5) provides an accessible restroom facility. This project consisted of the renovation of the nursery bathrooms to meet ADA requirements. This improvement was completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits of this project to the NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 100% accessible restroom facility within the club, (2) provides a smooth surface condition for easier use, (3) provides appropriate grab bars to assist in movement, and (4) provides additional apparatus' aided towards accessibility: soap dispenser, paper towel dispenser, mirrors, toilet paper holders for ease of use. This site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed towards accessibility. We are requesting 100%. This includes the cost of the required labor, materials, equipment, implements, parts, and supplies necessary for the renovation. Please see Appendix F for additional information.

### Olympic Park Playground Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible play activities, (3) enables children to interact and play, and (4) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 59%. #### Victory Park Playground Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides accessible play activities, (2) enables children to interact and play, and (3) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 39%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground, and cost for the safety surfacing. Please see appendix H for additional information.

#### Victory Park ADA Pathway Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing walk up to and around the playground at Victory Park. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to the NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible entrance walk into the playground, (2) provides a 5' wide accessible entrance walk around the park, (3) provides smooth surface condition for easier use, and (4) provides accessible benches around the playground and park. This site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 100%. This includes the cost of the materials and installation of the walk, patron bench pads, and ADA fountain pad, as well as the cost for demolition, excavation, and restoration. Please see Appendix I for additional information.

#### Lake Arlington Park Playground Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible play activities, (3) enables children to interact and play, and (4) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 67%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground, cost for the safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see appendix J for additional information.

#### Camelot Park Pedestrian Bridge Replacement

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the current bridge with a new pedestrian bridge. These improvements were completed in the spring of 2010. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 6' accessible path connecting the sidewalks, (2) provides a smooth surface condition for easier use, and (3) provides a continuance of the accessible path throughout the park. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 83%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, removal, disposal, and installation of the new bridge. Please see appendix K for additional information.

#### Patriots Park- Parking Lot Improvements

The project consisted of the excavation, furnishing, and installation of the required materials and equipment for the Parking Lot and Site Improvements. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2009. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a safe and accessible means from the parking lot into the park, (2) provides a 5' walk into the park, and (3) provides accessible parking spaces. We are requesting 24%. This includes the cost of the concrete walk, detectable warning plates, depressed curb, and the pavement markings for the ADA stalls and symbols. Please see appendix L for additional information.

ADA State Required Elevator Upgrades

This project consisted of the installation of all state required mechanical/electrical upgrades on three district-owned hydraulic elevator installations located at the Administration Center, Forest View Racquet and Fitness Club, and Arlington Lakes Golf Course Clubhouse. The upgrades included: new mechanical car door restrictors, new emergency lighting and alarm bell units, and infrared full door protection devices at all three locations, and to install a new hands-free auto dialing ADA emergency speakerphone with voice software at the Administration Center only. These updates were completed in the spring of 2009. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides access to all floors of the building, (2) provides protection and means of communication in emergency situations, (3) provides up-to-date equipment in compliance with state standards, and (4) provides safe and reliable ease of access for all users. The primary purpose of the elevator was to accommodate towards accessibility and therefore all requirements related to upkeep can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 100%. This includes the cost of the management, transportation, tools, supplies, equipment, and labor necessary to complete the installation.



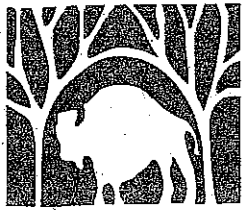

The Buffalo Grove Park District hereby requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's Special Recreation Levy to pay for the following improvements.

1. The purchase of two NuStep Recumbent Cross Trainers. The NuStep is an adaptable piece of equipment for able-bodied individuals to others with more complex physical limitations. The machine has a larger seat to ensure stability of the user. The seat also swivels 90 degrees to the left or right allowing for ease of access when transferring from a standing position or from a wheelchair. There are several adjustments to accommodate individuals from 5 ft tall to well over 6 ft tall in addition to multiple resistance settings for all fitness levels. The machine also features upper body and lower body movement. This is a great option for individuals who have suffered from a stroke or other forms of paralysis since it allows both stability and an opportunity to move all 4 limbs.

Cost \$7,665.

2. The Emmerich Park exterior improvements will bring the entire park up to ADA standards. Please see the attached spreadsheet with ADA code improvements and cost. The total project cost was \$2,364,677.

The exterior park improvements attributed to ADA cost is \$99,320.54.

3. Emmerich Park new addition of accessible washrooms to serve park users.

Cost \$225,000

4. Emmerich building fire alarm system to include audible and visual alarms to comply with sections 215 and 702 of ADA.

Cost \$12,588.25

5. Emmerich building interior improvements include raising the existing concrete floor from front entranceway back and into interior washrooms and program rooms and to back door to meet ADA standards, and provide the required accessibility route. Renovation of existing interior washrooms to meet ADA standards. The interior improvements totaled \$325,000 and the architect's estimated 25% or \$81,250 attributed to ADA improvements.
