Willow Stream Pool Improvements – You may recall that last year we sought reimbursement for the renovation of the bathhouse at Willow Stream. At the time, the other improvements to the pool deck, filtration system and handicapped accessible ramp had not been completed. As a result, we of course held off on requesting reimbursement. By June 2011, new decks, a ramp, and new mechanical equipment installed to address ADA needs highlighted in our ADA Audit and listed in our transition plan.

Deck improvements were needed for a variety of reasons. Though the decks had certainly many years of wear, the primary reason for replacing the decks was to address pitch and slope issues itemized in our ADA Audit completed by the National Center on Accessibility in 2008. In addition, we installed a ramp into our pool to allow for access. Finally, the new filters, pumps and chemical feeders were "sized" to address the increased filtration and sanitation needs of the ramp. Finally, a handicapped accessible fountain is included in the reimbursement request.



The Rolling Meadows Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the Districts Special Recreation levy to pay for the cost of the following improvements to facilities and purchase of equipment:

1. Fitness Center

As noted in the ADA audit of 2009 not only did the layout of the Nelson Sports Complex Fitness Center need to be changed but most of the equipment available to the public was not accessible. A list of the equipment and a room layout is attached for your review. Cost of accessible fitness center equipment, \$19,960 we are attributing 50% to the cost of ADA compliance \$9,980.

2. Nelson Sports Complex General ADA Improvements

The installation of automatic sliding doors to the main entrance of Nelson Sports Complex. Cost for the Automatic Doors was \$22,608. We attribute 50% of this project to accessibility, \$11,304. We are requesting 100% use of the fund for sidewalk elevation and detectable ramp improvements, \$7,500 (at the main entrance) as well as the purchase of ADA picnic tables \$4,850, for the facility and park.

3. Bus Purchase

Purchase of a 39 Passenger Handicap Accessible passenger bus. The purchase of this bus will greatly enhance the District opportunities to provide program transportation for individuals with varying abilities. Total cost of the bus is \$119,673.

4. Community Center Parking Lot Improvements - Phase A

As identified in the 2009 ADA Audit, the Community Center parking lot was non-compliant. Total cost of parking lot excavation and replacement was \$193,200; \$64,400 (1/3 of this project is attributed to creating accessibility to the Pre School entrance, Senior Center entrance, Community Center playground and Senior Park area. Detectable ramp and slope issues were corrected as well as improvements to handicapped parking spaces. A copy of the ADA Improvements achieved is attached for your review.

All of these projects directly meet the strategic goal of providing accessibility to residents of all ages and abilities.

The Rolling Meadows Park District respectfully requests that you review this request and present it with your approving recommendation to the NWSRA Board of Directors.



The Rolling Meadows Park District purchased an ADA Accessible bus in fiscal year 2011-2012 and requests 100% of the cost be taken from the Handicapped Fund of the District. The primary reason for the purchase of the bus was to insure the District has accessible transportation for any resident or non-resident that may need an accommodation on one of our trips or for our programs that require transportation.

As specifications were prepared for the purchase, staff took in to consideration data relating to our programs, past and current participants as well as looking to the future of our programs. Our current senior center membership is 600 and growing (many of these participants have ambulatory issues). The Teen Camp of the District as well as the days off school trips has had an ongoing requested accommodation since 2009.



This project was part of an undertaking by Township High School District 214 to renovate Wheeling High School's stadium complex. In May 2011, Wheeling Park District entered into an Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement with the School District to share the cost to install a synthetic turf surface on the field. As a provision of the agreement, when the stadium is not being utilized by the School District, it may be used during certain hours for community recreation activities sponsored by the Park District, such as flag football, and adult and youth soccer programs.

Among other items, the project's scope of work included civil engineering services, protection of track surfaces, excavation and base preparation, synthetic turf, concrete curb and nailer, goal posts, and site utilities. These improvements were completed in 2011. The benefits of this project to NWSRA participants are as follows: 1) a universally accessible athletic field, 2) smooth and even surface condition for easier use, 3) a playing surface for those with or without disabilities, and 4) a safe and resilient, year-round playing surface. 

Dear Lou,

The Park District expansion of the Bandshell at Lions Memorial Park will remove barriers to accessibility and provide two way barrier free access to the Park from the street and the neighborhood. Patrons will more easily access the Bandshell, Playfields and Community Center with these new improvements.

The improvements will be a combination of poured in place concrete and concrete paver walks. These walks are designed to meet or exceed the "ADA 2010 Standards for Accessible Design".

These walks will include 300 lineal feet of concrete walk (5' wide) and 400 lineal feet of concrete paver walk (7'-4" wide). We recommend the Park District be reimbursed for two way accessible improvements to 5' in width. The estimated installed cost for concrete walk is \$6 a square foot and 1500 square feet for an estimated cost of \$9,000. The estimated installed cost for concrete paver walk is \$9 a square foot for 2000 square feet for an estimated cost of \$18,000.

The Mount Prospect Park District is making improvements that will remove barriers to accessibility and will meet or exceed the "ADA 2010 Standards for Accessible Design". We recommend the Mount Prospect Park District be reimbursed \$27,000 for these improvements.

Centennial Park-Parking Lot Improvements

The project consisted of the excavation, furnishing, and installation of the required materials and equipment for the parking lot and site improvements. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a safe and accessible means from the parking lot into the park, (2) provides a 6' walk into the park, and (3) provides accessible parking spaces. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width of the concrete walk can be attributed to accessibility with secondary purposes including equipment accommodation and extracurricular activities (i.e. biking) via additional width not included in the amount requested. We are requesting 17%. Evergreen Park- Playground Renovation

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides access up to and into the playground, (2) provides access to the picnic area (3) provides accessible play activities, (4) enables children to interact and play, and (5) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 51%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground that was required to complete the accessible portion of the work, cost for the accessible safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. This project was completed in coordination with Evergreen Park- Pathway Improvements as presented below. Please see Appendix B for additional information.

Evergreen Park-Pathway Improvements

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing pathway with a 9' path, as well as the removal and replacement of four bench pads and installation of an accessible picnic area. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. We are requesting 50%. This includes a percentage of the material cost and installation of the pathways and bench pads, as well as a percentage of the cost for demolition, excavation, and restoration that was required to complete the accessible portion of the work. Please see Appendix B for additional information.

Recreation Park-Playground Renovation

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible benches and picnic area, (3) provides accessible play activities, (4) enables children to interact and play, and (5) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 71%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground that was required to complete the accessible portion of the work, cost for the accessible safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see Appendix C for additional information.

Melas Park-Playground Renovation

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the existing playground with new accessible equipment, surfacing and entry walk. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a 5' wide accessible path up to and into the playground, (2) provides accessible benches and picnic area, (3) provides accessible play activities, (4) enables children to interact and play, and (5) enables children to learn social skills. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of the equipment, materials, and costs associated with the accessible features utilized can be attributed to accessibility. We are requesting 52%. This includes a percentage of the equipment cost, demolition, excavation, installation, and restoration of the playground that was required to complete the accessible portion of the work, cost for the accessible safety surfacing, and cost of the concrete work for the playground. Please see Appendix D for additional information.

Happiness Park- ADA Picnic Table

The project consisted of the purchase and installation of an ADA picnic table for accessible use. This improvement was completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits the NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides accessible picnic area near the playground and (2) completes recommendation regarding the Arlington Heights Park District ADA transition plan identified by the Arlington Heights Park District ADA Committee in 2009. We are requesting 100% cost of the materials. This does not include the cost of installation. Please see Appendix E for additional information.

Patriots Park- Access to Ball Field, ADA Player & Bleacher Pads

This project consisted of the removal and replacement of the 7' wide concrete pathway and access from the parking lot, 6' wide ball field walks, and 5' wide connector walks to all of the ball fields, in addition to concrete pads for the player benches and bleacher pads. These improvements were completed in the fall of 2011. The site was not previously accessible, and the primary purpose of installation of 5' of the width can be attributed to accessibility with secondary purposes including equipment accommodation and extracurricular activities (i.e. biking) via additional width not included in the amount requested. We are requesting 47%. This includes a percentage of the material cost and installation of the pathway, player bench pads, and bleacher pads, as well as a percentage of the cost for demolition, excavation, and restoration that was required to complete the accessible portion of the work. Please see Appendix F for additional information.

John Hersey-School-Synthetic Turf Cooperative

This project consisted of the installation of a synthetic turf athletic field on John Hersey High School grounds. The Arlington Heights Park District worked in coordination with Township High School District 214 on this project in anticipation of benefits for the Park District including but not limited to increased programming and accessible usage. The breakdown of the scope of work included: protection of the track surfaces, excavation and base preparation, furnish and installation of site utilities, concrete curb and nailer, goal posts, field turf, and restoration of adjacent surfaces. These improvements were completed in the summer of 2011. The benefits of this project to NWSRA are as follows: (1) provides a universally accessible athletic field, (2) provides smooth and even surface condition for easier use, (3) provides a playing surface for those with or without disabilities, (4) offers high impact attenuation, and (5) provides a safe and resilient playing surface year-round. This athletic field was not previously accessible. The Park District contributed to approximately 25% of the project via contract, with 8% of the total being attributed to the Park District's accessibility funds. We are requesting 33% of the Park District's contribution to the project, also denoted as 8% of the project total. Please see Appendix G for additional information.


Happiness is a mini-park in the north central section of town. Located adjacent to a fenced village retention lake, Happiness also includes a small two lot parcel on the other side of the retention lake. The playground at Happiness was renovated in 2003. The playground equipment meets all ADA standards, with the only issue being that of accessibility to the sand play structure. The following are the recommendations for Happiness Park:

1. Sand play structure access can be solved by adding playground tiles from the concrete path up to the structure and by removing some of the sand beneath to bring up the level of the play structure to the proper height.

2. A fixed picnic table was left when the playground was renovated. This table is not an accessible model and is not on an accessible route. Concrete work is needed on the curb surrounding the playground (vandalism damage in 2008.) The existing table can be removed and modified to meet standards. It can then be moved closer to the path by the existing walkway. The cost will be less because concrete workers will already be in the park removing and replacing the curb.

3. Access from the street is identified as a barrier. The current curb is marked for repair. Staff will work with the Village to assure that accessibility issues are addressed.




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





LUBATION MAP

The Bartlett Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy to pay the cost of the following improvements:

The following projects have been completed and are described below.

Phase I ADA Transition Plan. Two items from Phase I of the ADA Transition Plan were completed in 2011. The asphalt path at Humbracht Park was removed and replaced with an asphalt path that meets current ADA guidelines for accessible routes to the playground, the wetland overlook deck, and interpretive signage. At Riley's Run dog park, additional asphalt was installed within the fenced areas of the dog park to meet accessibility recommendations in the Transition Plan.

Playground Surfacing. Certified engineered wood fiber was added to several of the District's existing playgrounds in order to bring safety surface levels up to acceptable levels for accessibility to ramps and play equipment along with providing impact attenuation in the play area.

Centennial Playground. Centennial Park/school playground project was the replacement of an existing play structure at a park/school site. The project created a concrete accessible ramp that leads to an accessible play surface with a new play structure that has multiple accessible play events at ground level and on the structure. A transition platform allows access onto the play structure. Site plan attached.

Kjar Park Playground. Kjar Park project was the replacement of an existing wooden play structure that was not accessible and had no accessible route from the residential sidewalk to the play area. The project created a concrete accessible walk and ramp that leads to an accessible picnic table and to the play surface where there is a new play structure with multiple accessible play events at ground level and on the structure via a transition platform. Site plan attached.

Community Center Elevator Maintenance. The elevator at the Bartlett Community Center accesses all four levels of the facility, including program rooms, summer camp rooms, the health club, racquetball courts, indoor aquatics and indoor track. The submitted costs are for the contracted regular maintenance and inspection of this elevator.

Apple Orchard West Basketball Court Renovation. The AO West basketball court has four half courts and one full court and was renovated with new asphalt, color coating and lines. The court has accessible routes and is lighted for evening use.

The following are two projects that are under construction and will be completed within six months.

Beaver Pond Park Development. Beaver Pond Park is used by many residents for fishing throughout the year, and the Park District holds a youth fishing derby here every August with over three hundred participants. Unfortunately, this park was not accessible to all of our residents. To get to the pond or an existing shady picnic table, park users had to cross large, uneven turf areas. In accordance with the District's Comprehensive Master Plan and the ADA Transition Plan, this park was to be made accessible with an ADA accessible path and was to connect to the community-wide path system. The attached plan was reviewed by the public and Board of Commissioners, and an OSLAD Grant was applied for and approved by the IDNR.

The accessible elements of the plan include the following:

- An eight-foot wide multi-use accessible pathway encircling the pond, connecting with the community bike path to the south and providing access to handicap parking east and west of the park.
- 2. Fishing stations provide paved handicap access to the pond shore.

- Creating an accessible fishing area in the District was emphasized throughout the many stages of approval needed for this project; therefore, half of the asphalt and associated site work is being requested for reimbursement.
- 4. A handicap accessible floating fishing pier with railings, shade and seating. There is an accessible picnic shelter with picnic tables, several seating areas along the path, and several shaded accessible picnic spots.
- 5. Horseshoe pits are accessible via a concrete walk with benches.
- 6. Nature stations with interpretive signage.

This unique park will have our only accessible fishing pond that helps to meet the recreational needs of those with accessibility issues. We anticipate the completion of this project in May of 2012.

Blue Heron Park Development. This six acre park has an existing 16 car parking lot and was acquired by developer donation in 2008. A design plan was produced and an OSLAD Grant was acquired for this park development that has the following accessible features:

An asphalt pathway encircles the park with several seating areas positioned along the
path. A crosswalk connects this path entrance to the community wide bike path system.
Three feet of the eight foot wide path has been calculated as the accessible portion.

- An accessible picnic area with a shelter and handicap accessible picnic tables. On the one side of this is an accessible splash playground that and on the other side is an accessible playground with multiple features designed for 2-12 year olds.
- 3. To the north is an accessible bags court for this popular game that is played by various age groups.
- 4. Adults and children can practice their golf skills on an accessible artificial turf putting green.
- 5. There is also an accessible overlook with seating areas and interpretive signage dealing with the adjacent pond and heron rookery.

#### ONE (1) NEW 20 PASSENGER SHUTTLE BUS

These specifications apply to One (1) New 20 Passenger Shuttle Bus to be purchased. Only vehicle meeting these specifications and/or equivalent will be accepted.

#### Purpose

The purpose of these specifications is to describe a mid-size shuttle bus, which will be used to transport park district patrons and wheelchair passengers for park district programs. The bus will be constructed as a unibody matrix of steel and fiberglass reinforced plastics and resin hardened composite that offers a light weight and non-corrosive body panels. The bus body is to be mounted on a Ford RV Cutaway chassis, E-450 series with the "Shuttle Bus Prep Package (Ford Option 47B)" included. All vehicle suppliers must conform to this technical specification. Metal exterior skinned buses will not be accepted.

#### General

This specification is written around specific needs of this agency. With the intent to standardize certain components, therefore in numerous places we have named specific brands of components. This has been done to establish a certain standard of quality. Other brands will be considered providing the vendor provides documentation clearly describing any variation to these bid specifications. Such requests must meet or exceed the specification called for in this bid document. The determination of the Schaumburg Park District regarding any such request as far as accepting or denying said request will be final.

#### **Materials**

All materials used in conversion of the bus shall be new and conform in all respects to American Society of Testing Materials, society of Automotive Engineers or similar association standards.

#### **VEHICLE BODY**

#### **Body, General Construction**

The body structure shall be built as an integral unit. All joints and corners where stress concentration may occur shall be adequately reinforced to carry required loads and withstand road shock. The bus body shall be certified by an independent testing agency to meet the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard Number 220 (school bus rollover protection) and FMVSS 221. Certification of compliance with these tests shall be provided with the submission of this bid.

#### **Body Frame Structure**

Multi point rubber isolators shall be used to mount body to the cab chassis. All structural fabrication shall use 1010/1020 low carbon hot rolled steel. All exposed steel shall be treated with an anti-corrosive protective material.

The substructure shall be made of combination of at least five (5)  $2^{\circ}x3^{\circ}$ , 14 gauge tubular steel outriggers,  $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}x4\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ , 11 gauge C-channel, 12 gauge "seat track" and  $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}x1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}x2^{\circ}$ , 14 gauge Z channel welded into ladder type structure and bolted to the OEM chassis frame on rubber isolators.

#### **Body Panels**

Roof and front and rear caps shall be fiberglass properly attached to side walls forming a unibody design without exposed fasteners or protruding fasteners.

Body panels (side walls) shall consist of a matrix of fiberglass reinforced plastic. Exterior surfaces shall be a minimum of .020" thickness of high gloss gelcoat to prevent moisture penetration and corrosion. The center layer shall consist of ¾" (2 lb. density) polyurethane foam. Steel sections shall be integrated into the roof and sidewalls to provide additional structural integrity and to provide sound attachment surfaces for various features or options and provide a fully integrated steel roll cage. Front and rear caps and roof shall be FRP material.

#### Interior

Wall and head liner are to be of ABS or FRP bright white material. All interior trim pads are to be gray vinyl.

#### Mirrors

Mirrors shall consist of two (2) exterior mirrors with non-corrosive heads each incorporating a flat 7"x9" mirror and a 7"x5" convex spot mirror located in the bottom portion of mirror head. **Mirrors shall be power and heated.** Interior shall have a 6" x 9" mirror for viewing passenger area.

#### Passenger Entrance Door

- A. The entry door shall be fully encompassed by an integrally welded steel door surround and stepwell. The complete door surround will incorporate the step well, and shall be installed in the body as a single unit. Door frame structure shall be made of high quality steel and shall be finished with high gloss powder coat paint. The door shall have a full clear opening width of at least 32" and a full height of at least eighty inches (80").
- B. The entry door shall be a two-leaf, outward opening type, electric operated and controlled from the driver's seat.
- C. Door panels shall incorporate full view one piece tinted safety glass with anodized aluminum framing.
- D. At the meeting edges of each door leaf, a rubber seal shall be installed so that the edges form a tight overlapping seal when closed.
- E. A 1¼" stainless steel grab bar (stanchion) shall be securely fastened to both sides of the interior of the doorway parallel to the steps to assist passengers in entering or exiting the vehicle. Full view plexi glass style door panels are not acceptable.
- F. All fasteners shall be stainless steel or non-corrosive type.
- G. Door shall have an exterior mounted entrance door key switch that is hot all the time.

The floor covering shall be R.C.A. Transit Rubber. The floor shall be covered with 3/16" ribbed flooring on the step risers and center aisle. Rest of the flooring shall be 1/8" smooth flooring. Steps shall have a 2" white safety nosing on each step edge. Step tread shall be of one-piece rubber flooring. The floor covering shall be butt jointed and securely cemented to the plywood floor with a waterproof adhesive. The floor sub-structure shall be covered with a minimum of ¾" thick solid piece plywood FRP encased floor pattern cut to the floor plan desired. Entire underside (where permitted by chassis manufacturer) shall be covered with commercial grade undercoating in bus. This is extremely important due to the highly corrosive climate in which the bus will be operated. Floor covering shall be grey in color.

#### Windows

- A. The windshield is to be a one-piece design. Windshield shall be laminated tinted safety glass.
- B. The driver's window shall be capable of opening. This window shall be tempered or laminated safety glass.
- C. The side passenger windows shall be transit type, as opposed to the school bus type. It is desired to maintain a transit type appearance, and school bus type windows will not be accepted. The passenger windows shall be certified by an independent testing agency to be in compliance with FMVSS 217 (Bus window Retention and Release). Certification of compliance with FMVSS 217 shall be provided with submission of this bid. Passenger windows must be capable of opening to ensure ventilation. Windows shall be an upper T-Sliding design in situations where smaller filter windows are required.
- D. Side and rear hinged emergency escape windows must be provided per FMVSS requirements. Emergency windows must be clearly labeled and operating instructions must be clearly visible.
- E. All egress windows shall be so identified and include operating instructions. All passenger windows must be safety glass with an AS-3 marking. Windows are to be dark tinted to a maximum of 23% light transmission. All passenger windows shall be installed in black powder coated anodized aluminum frames. All passenger windows shall have a minimum viewing area of 34" tall by 24" wide, except where the floor plan desired requires the use of one smaller (filler) window on each side. Any filler windows used must be same height as standard window.

#### Lighting

Interior: Shall consist of one (1) step well light to illuminate entrance area adequately when door is opened and one(1) drivers courtesy light that activates when drivers door is opened or with headlight switch. Passenger cabin shall be illuminated by lights (min of 3 each side) that are mounted above the windows in the wall to roof transition panel or above the center aisle. These lights shall active when the entrance door is open or with a separate interior switch located by the driver. An exterior light, that meets ADA requirements, shall be mounted in the body skirt by the front entrance door. This too shall activate when the door is opened.

Exterior: Shall consist of OEM chassis standard front cab light configuration. In addition, body shall have five (5) amber clearance lamps on the front and five (5) red on the rear in ICC configuration. On the upper rear left and right side corners of the body, there shall be one (1) red light that matches the clearance lamps.

Rear of bus shall have a license plate lamp, two (2) 4" round tail/stop lamps, two (2) 4" round white back up lamps and two (2) 4" round amber turn signals. Lamps shall be installed in a manner that is aesthetically pleasing and in combination form. School bus type lamps are not acceptable.

Vehicle shall have high mount center stop lamp.

#### **Drive Console**

A separate drivers console shall be included for the purpose of accommodating all switches that are installed by body manufacture. The shall include but not limited to electric door switch, heater switch, air conditioning controls, interior passenger lights switch and power lift switch.

All switches installed by the body manufacture shall be push or heavy duty rocker style that are back lit for night operation and labeled as to use. Only exception is regarding rear air conditioning switches which shall be those supplied by the air conditioning manufacturer.

#### <u>Wiring</u>

All wiring shall follow a uniform code color, and be numbered and/or function coded to allow with ease the identity of individual wires throughout the vehicle.

There shall be two (2) fuse/relay boxes. One shall be chassis OEM installed and shall not be altered in any way. The other shall be for body and components as installed by the body manufacturer. This junction box shall be installed on the interior of the vehicle.

An electrical wiring diagram shall be supplied with the vehicle for all body components.

#### Air Conditioning

Shall consist of chassis OEM dash air conditioning and body manufacturer installed rear air conditioning. Capacity of unit shall be a minimum of 60,000 BTU's with. System shall incorporate a 3 fan skirt mounted condenser and dual compressors Evaporator shall be installed in the rear of the vehicle above the rear window. Bidder shall submit information on make and type of air conditioning proposed along with wiring/plumbing diagrams with bid.

#### **Heating**

Shall consist of chassis OEM dash heater/defrost and one rear floor mounted heater with minimum of 65,000 BTUs. An exterior mounted shut off valve shall be supplied for the rear heater.

#### Stanchions, Hand Rails and Modesty Panels

Bus shall have a vertical and horizontal stanchion and modesty panels mounted behind the entrance door and driver seat. There shall also be a right and left entrance rail at step area. These hand rails shall be mounted in a manner that allows passengers to grasp throughout the accent or decent of the vehicle. The hand rails shall follow the incline of the steps. Hand rails and stanchions shall be stainless steel.

All modesty panels/stanchions shall allow for a minimum of 11/2", knuckle space for passenger grasp.

#### <u>Seats</u>

**Driver:** Shall be high back reclining bucket seat with right arm rest. The seat shall be covered with gray cloth insert and vinyl trim level 2 material.

**Passengers:** Bus shall be able to accommodate 16 passengers plus 2 wheelchairs on board. Seating shall consist of the following: Passenger seat shall consist of eight (8) double mid high back style seats with 4 sets on each side of aisle. All seats shall be featherweight Freedman seating type or approved equal.

Two (2) 34" MID HIGH Notch back fold away seats shall be installed in the left rear corner (street side).

All passenger seats shall be covered with commercial grade seat material. Color to be selected upon award. Seat material shall be level 3.

All seat positions shall have retractable seat belts that meet all FMVSS requirements. Fixed seats are to have fixed (not traveling type) retractors. Flip seats may have lap traveling type retractors.

Seats shall have aisle side hard rubber flip armrest and vandal resistant seat back assist rails. See attached floor plan for desired seat/wheelchair layout.

#### Reverse Alarm

Vehicle is to be equipped with a reverse alarm that activates when the transmission is put in reverse.

#### Paratransit Equipment

**Lift:** Bus shall have a Braun NCL919 lift that meets all ADA and FMVSS403 requirements. Lift shall be mounted on the right side behind the rear axle.

Lift shall be equipped with a transmission/park brake interlock system that prohibits vehicle from moving if lift doors are open. System shall incorporate lights that indicate proper driver operation to allow lift to function. An integrated fast idle system is also required.

**Lift Doors**: Shall be of double panel construction. Each panel shall have a door handle with at least one of these handle to have a key lock cylinder for the purpose of locking and securing the bus. Each door panel shall have a window installed at or approximately the same height as the side passenger windows. Door panels shall be constructed of corrosive resistant material and have proper sealing to eliminate water/air leaks. Frames shall be secured with stainless steel fasteners or corrosion resistant fasteners.

Each door panel shall have heavy duty gas filled shocks or over center props to hold door open and full length piano style stainless steel hinges.

Lift door shall meet the minimum requirements of ADA regarding clear opening height and width as it applies to buses in excess of 22 feet.

**Lift Lights:** An interior light shall be mounted above the lift door as well as an exterior flush mounted lift light which shall be mounted in the skirt of the bus and centered below the lift doors. Illumination requirements of these lights shall meet ADA requirements. These lights shall activate when the lift doors are opened and shall be independent of vehicle driving lamps

**Mobility Aid/Passenger Restraint Belt System:** Shall be manufactured by Q-Straint, model "Q-8100-A1-L" auto retracting type, and be the "L" style and consist of four (4) straps that secure wheelchairs in place and a combination retractable lap/shoulder harness for wheelchair passengers. These securement systems must meet all ADA requirements. Track in floor must be flush mounted. Bus shall be able to accommodate two (2) wheelchairs and have two (2) complete sets of belts as described above.

**Priority Decals:** Decals indicating that wheelchair positions are reserved for those with mobility aid devices as well as one set of forward facing seats that are reserved for passengers with disabilities shall be installed. These decals are to meet all ADA requirements.

**Belt Storage Compartment:** A storage compartment located in the nose cone of the bus above the front windshield shall be supplied. This compartment shall be of adequate space to store wheelchair belts when not in use and shall be a minimum of 40" wide by 12" high and 12" deep. Compartment shall be lined with carpet or vinyl type material and have a fiberglass door panel with thumb turn latches.



Lindbergh Park \$30,000 This park renovation included playground equipment that has both a transfer platform and ramp to access the play equipment. The play equipment includes color coded activities for sound, texture and accessibility. Signage for the compass and globe encourage interactive social and educational games. The super nova and tire swing encourage side by side play. The area includes accessible seating and picnic tables on an accessible path. The engineered wood fiber play surface and rubber tile surfaces provide access to the 2 adaptive swings and play equipment. The large picnic shelter was replaced and an accessible route to the shelter, soccer bleachers and tennis courts was installed. Accessible picnic tables and benches were also added. An accessible route to the playground and school from Biesterfield Road was installed to shorten the distance for access to the site.

<u>Debra Park</u> \$16,500 Park renovation included playground equipment that has transfer platforms to access the new play equipment. The play equipment has textural and social play areas. The area includes accessible seating and picnic tables from an accessible path. The engineered wood fiber play surface provides access to the adaptive swing and play equipment.

<u>Audubon Park</u> \$1,500. New accessible route and accessible portable toilet added near the two ball diamonds.

Hanson Park \$1475 New accessible route and accessible portable toilet added near the soccer field and Kenneth Young Center Basketball area.

<u>Jensen Park</u> \$9,000 Replacement of cracked broken walk to connect public walk to new picnic shelter and accessible table and bench.

<u>Marshall Park</u> \$600 Concrete walk and accessible portable toilet added near the soccer field and playground.

<u>Morton Park</u> \$6,000 New concrete walks extending the access to Salt Creek and the park's practice soccer field and seating areas. This is the second of 3 phases to improve access to the park.
