The Elk Grove Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy, to pay the cost of the following improvements.

The estimated costs of improvements are **\$136,479.00**. The improvements will be completed by December 30, 2011. Anticipated benefits of the project to NWSRA are as follows:

Carson Park \$12,800. This park renovation included playground equipment that has both a transfer platform and ramp to access the play equipment. The area includes accessible seating and picnic tables from an accessible path. The engineered wood fiber play surface provides access to the adaptive swing and play equipment. The basketball court was repaired to provide a smooth transition from the walk to the playing surface and an accessible picnic table was added.

Marsh Park \$12,000 As part of the renovations of the playground a new accessible walk connects the public sidewalk with the play area. New accessible route with bench to portable toilet. Site furniture includes several benches and tables accessible to all. The playground equipment now meets the recommended number of accessible play units for the 5-12 year olds including a transfer station.

Fountain Square Park Renovation \$80,000. Fountain Square was the first splash pad in the area 17 years ago. The old splash pad included a water slide/combination play structure on poured in place surfacing. The new splash pad has a concrete finish and all features are at ground level. A new family game court was constructed with an accessible baggo, court, bocce court, picnic shelter, site furnishings, ornamental fountain and sensory garden, portable toilet enclosures and diaper changing stations, accessible sand play area and accessible drinking fountain. Fitness stations along a walking path allow for supervision and recreation near the playground and splash pad. The splash pad and park improvements were funded in part by an OSLAD grant and capital funds.

Andrews Park \$1,500 A new concrete walk was installed connecting the public sidewalk with a new bleacher pad and accessible portable toilet near the baseball and soccer fields.

Clark Park \$2,380 Concrete walk repairs and new connections were made along the disc golf course within the park.

Jensen South Park \$1850 Additional walk to connect playground with basketball court at proper slope.

Johnson Park \$4,440 Replacement of old asphalt trail with new concrete walk at proper grades for accessible route within the park and to the school.

Drinking Fountain Replacements \$2,220 Upgrade and replace drinking fountains in Audubon and Fairchild Parks to make them accessible (\$960). \$150 to replace a very old non-compliant drinking fountain in the Adult Center of the Hattendorf Center. Additional funds provided by the operating fund of the Hattendorf Center. \$280 for


replacement of drinking fountains in the Pavilion Aquatics the balance of funds from operations and maintenance.

Faucets, doors, door hardware and handrails \$9,234 At the Pavilion, Al Hattendorf Center and the Administration buildings new faucets and door hardware was installed to provide compliant fixtures. An assisted ADA door was installed at the Pavilion.

Pavilion Fitness Equipment \$10,055 for the purchase of a Cybex FT-450 Functional Trainer and a Cybex FT-360S Functional Trainer. Both pieces of equipment are ADA compliant. The Total Access line from Cybex is commercial fitness equipment designed to be accessible to the physically impaired but does not exclude other patrons. This allows fitness enthusiasts who have physical or sensory limitations to take advantage of fitness training on the same floor as others.

The Elk Grove Park District respectfully requests that you review this request for one hundred thirty-five thousand, four hundred seventy-nine dollars (\$135,129) and present it with your approving recommendation to the NWSRA Board of Directors. The Mt. Prospect Park District hereby requests approval from the NWSRA Board of Directors for expenditures to be paid from the Park District's Special Recreation levy. 

Mr. Ennesser,

Based on the current state of the life safety system, the following needs to be addressed:

- 1) The existing notification appliances need to be upgraded from the current frosted, low candela, free run type to the new Xenon bulb synchronized type. This will provide both the appropriate high intensity flash and the ADA required synchronized output.
- 2) Notification appliances are needed in many of the conference rooms and some of the restrooms. These will provide notification of a fire alarm to the hearing impaired per ADA requirements.

In order to accomplish this, the existing system infrastructure will be modified and the devices will be installed and tested. I have provided you with a total cost of \$39,742.00 for this work on a separate quotation. I believe that 100% of this cost is directly attributable to the ADA upgrade.

Wheeling Park District hereby requests approval from the Northwest Special Recreation Association Board of Directors to finance through the Special Populations Fund certain expenditures paid by the Park District in 2011. These expenditures are for consultative services provided by Recreation Accessibility Consultants (RAC) pertaining to the Americans with Disabilities Act, and accessibility improvements at Northside Park. The table below details the amount requested for each item.

ADA Consulting Services: Under Title II of the ADA, the Park District is required to conduct an evaluation that, according to the U.S. Department of Justice ADA Guidance and Material; includes: *A physical accessibility assessment and transition plan of all facilities where programs, services, and activities occur and steps to be taken to remedy any physical barriers that may exist.* In preparation for the District's efforts to comply with Title II, RAC was engaged to perform a complete audit of the District's facilities and to provide recommendations to achieve compliance. The report was presented to the Board of Commissioners on January 11, 2011. This report culminated an effort that began in July 2010 when the Board of Commissioners approved an agreement with RAC.


Accessibility Improvements at Northside Park: This undertaking included replacement of outdated play equipment with a new play structure, installation of new accessible playground safety surface, and installation of a new looped asphalt path. The benefits to NWSRA include a play structure that exceeds ADA guidelines for accessibility, an accessible playground surface to the play elements, and accessibility throughout the park.


Dear Ms. Julison:

This is in response to your request for additional information regarding the expenditures made by Wheeling Park District for Northside Park. The attached price quote and accessibility portion supplied by Little Tikes was used to determine the Special Populations apportionment. The total cost of the equipment as bid was \$92,300 because in addition to the Little Tikes primary play structure and swings, GameTime individual play pieces are also included on the playground (see attached playground plan); therefore, the 58% was applied to the total of all the play equipment.

For the safety surface, 100% is applied because the SMARTE surfacing is 100% accessible. Paths and permits are the same percentages that we've done in the past.

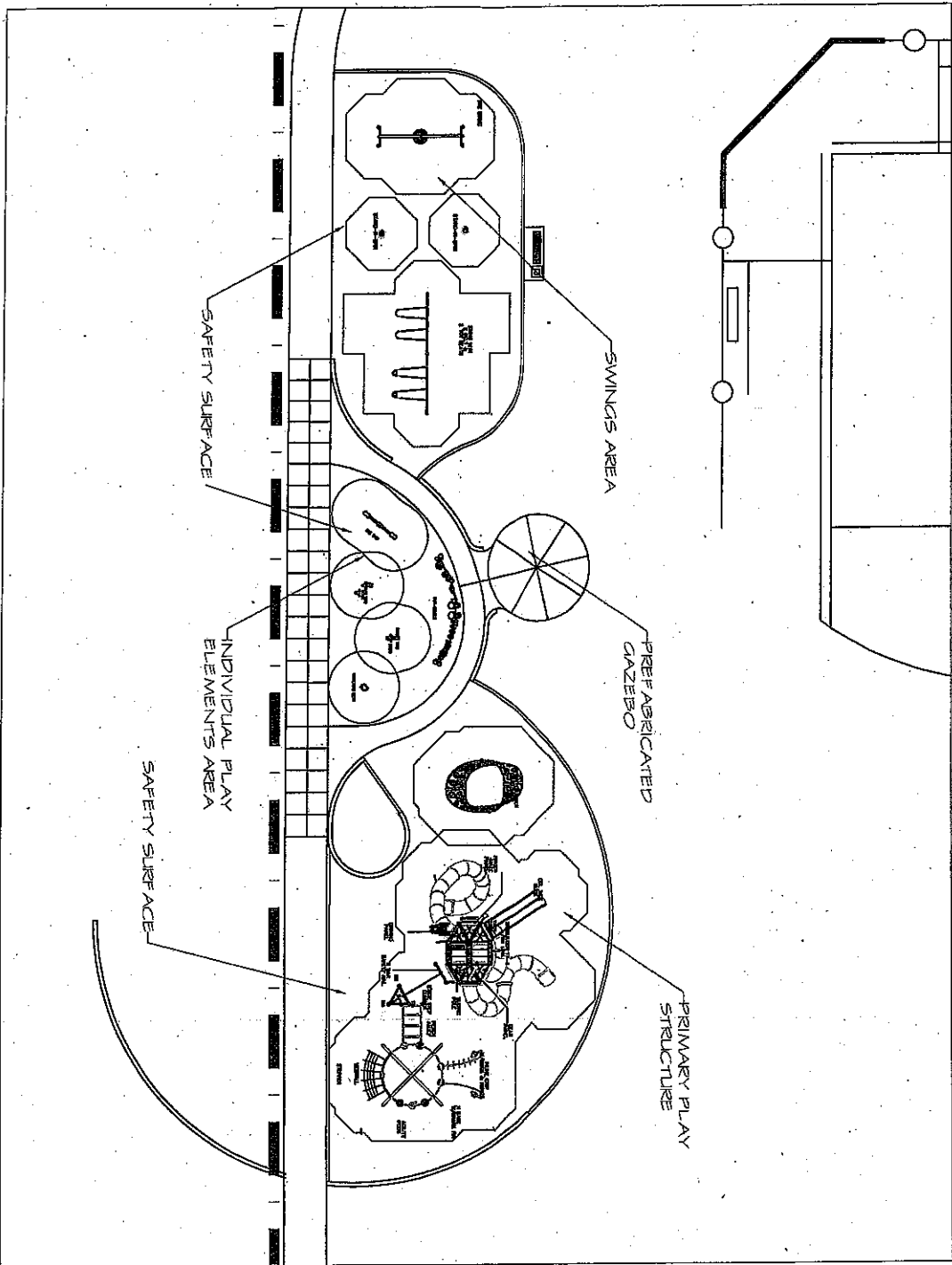

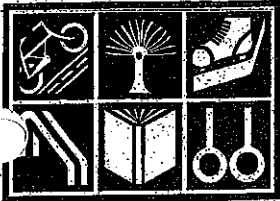

The Rolling Meadows Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the Districts Special Recreation levy to pay for the cost of the following improvements and projects within the scope of ADA Compliance.

1. Community Center Parking Lot project

Civil Engineers created a comprehensive engineering plan for improvements to access to the Community Center as well as the adjacent ball fields. The engineer utilized the ADA Transition Plan and the completed project included:

Design and engineering of parking lot to insure future ADA compliant installation as well as engineering of accessible sidewalks, paths and pads for bleachers / portable toilets. Cost for this project was \$12,790.

2. Sports Complex Locker Rooms ADA Drawings

Architectural Engineers created a comprehensive plan for improvements to the Nelson Sports Complex Locker Rooms to insure ADA compliance as the area is renovated in 2011/2012. Cost for this project was \$2,184.

The projects listed above were completed in 2010 and are described below.

ADA Transition Plan. The ADA transition plan was based on the previous Accessibility Audit and was completed and submitted to the Park District in September of 2010 by Recreation Accessibility Consultants. The transition plan includes a phased implementation of the recommendations along with cost estimates.

Administration Accessible Entrance and Routes. The Accessibility Audit found numerous gaps and changes in level, along with improper cross slopes and lack of proper landings, curb ramps and detectible warnings on the accessible routes to the Administration Building and the Schrade Gymnasium. This was in addition to the existing Administration handicap entrance being located at the rear of the building. The project created a new accessible route to the Administration front entrance, and new concrete walks, curb ramps, detectible warnings and signage were installed to provide proper accessible routes to both of these facilities. Site plan attached.

Community Center Parking Lot Renovation. As a part of the renovation of the Bartlett Community Center parking lot, thirteen new accessible parking stalls were seal coated and striped, and had signage installed. This was in addition to the restriping of twelve existing accessible stalls. All parking ADA signs not in compliance were changed or replaced. Site plan attached.


Playground Surfacing. Certified engineered wood fiber was replenished at several existing playgrounds in order to bring the safety surface levels up to acceptable levels for accessibility to ramps and play equipment along with providing impact attenuation in the play area.

Regency Oaks Playground. Regency Oaks Park project was the development of a one acre park site with an accessible playground and picnic area. A concrete accessible walk and ramp leads to an accessible picnic table and to the play surface where there is a play structure with multiple accessible play events at ground level and on the structure via a transition platform. Site plan attached.

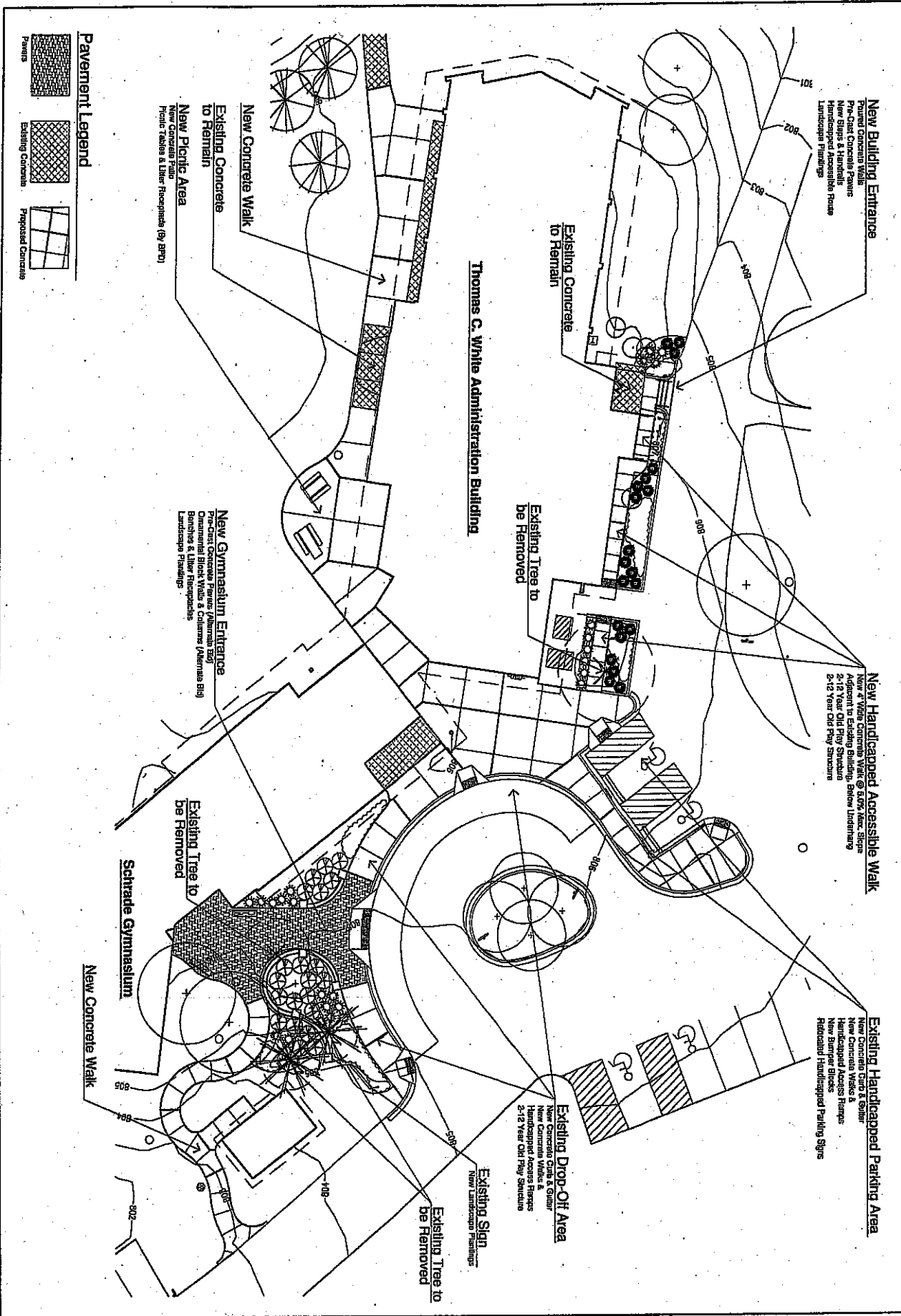
Windy Oaks Playground. Windy Oaks Park project was the replacement of an existing wooden play structure that was not accessible. The project created a concrete accessible walk and ramp that lead to an accessible picnic table and to the play surface where there is a play structure with multiple accessible play events at ground level and on the structure via a transition platform. The Buffalo Grove Park District hereby requests approval by the NWSRA Board of Directors for the proposed expenditure of funds from the District's Special Recreation Levy to pay for the following improvements:

1. Mirielle Playground Installation – The Buffalo Grove Park District had replaced the Mirielle Playground in 2000. However, during the Public Hearings on the ADA Transition Plan in November 2009, a family with a child with disabilities requested that the Park District add equipment that was specific to the needs of children with disabilities. It was noted that the equipment that had been installed by the Park District had features to accommodate those with disabilities, but that they did not resolve this child's access to play. To the Board's credit, they directed Staff to create a solution. The Mirielle reimbursement provides for the playground surface and equipment installation for this specific purpose. These improvements provide accessibility for the Buffalo Grove Park District Playgrounds and will be available for NWSRA programs and participants.

2. Canterbury Park Playground Installation – This is the replacement of a new playground with pour in place surfacing. The play apparatus features appropriate ramps, transfer stations and equipment to assure individuals with disabilities have the opportunity to play. These improvements provide accessibility for the Buffalo Grove Park District Playgrounds and will be available for NWSRA programs and participants.

3. ADA Assist Doors – As noted in our ADA Audit completed by the National Center on Accessibility, access at many of our exterior doors at our facilities did not comply with ADA standards. Either they needed to be installed, or the equipment needed to be upgraded. They strongly suggested improvements in this area. Exterior doors at Raupp, Golf Center and Twin Creeks were installed, while improvements in the electrical service were improved at Alcott and Emmerich to ensure uninterrupted service. This project provides accessible entrances for facilities and makes these facilities available for NWSRA programs and services.

4. Willow Stream Pool Renovation – The total cost for this project is expected to exceed \$2,200,000. This project includes the renovation of a six-lane, 25 yard pool along with all features associated with the facility. A substantial investment in this project was needed to improve the ADA deficiencies as found in our Accessibility Audit completed by the National Center on Disabilities in 2007. Our Transition Plan reemphasized the need to make the facility accessible to those with disabilities. Substantial deficiencies were found throughout the bath house especially in the bathrooms, showers, deck and locker room floor slopes and pitches, signage, and pool entry. These issues could not be addressed with simple solutions but required a substantial demolition and rebuild effort. In addition, they strongly suggested that this type of facility needed to have ADA compliant Family Changing Rooms to make the facility more welcoming to those individuals with disabilities.

To comply with this need, we essentially gutted our bathhouse removing all walls and floors. New plumbing and electrical runs were installed to allow for appropriate fixtures and the new family changing rooms. To make sure there was enough room for making all areas including the family changing rooms accessible, a small lobby area was added to the facility with accessible counters and entry doors, and a new manager/lifeguard structure was built separate from the bathhouse.

At this time, we are requesting reimbursement for only those parts of the project that are completed. Other areas to be completed in the coming months include the installation of an ADA compliant ramp and other improvements outside the bath house. Costs related ADA Improvements are listed below.



The Elk Grove Park District hereby notifies and requests approval of the NWSRA Board of Directors for the expenditure of funds from the District's special recreation levy, to pay the cost of the following improvements.

The estimated costs of improvements are **\$95,990.00**. The improvements were completed by December 1, 2010. Anticipated benefits of the project to NWSRA are as follows:

Appleseed Park \$12,400. This park renovation included playground equipment that has both a transfer platform and ramp to access the play equipment. The shaded center of the play area includes accessible seating from an accessible path. The engineered wood fiber play surface provides access to the adaptive swing and play equipment. A new 5' wide concrete path through the park connects with seating areas and accessible picnic tables.

Hattendorf Center Renovation \$50,000. The Al Hattendorf Center is home to the Park Districts Adult Center and Early Childhood Center. The existing playground was removed and a new accessible playground built. The nature themed play equipment is accessible by ramp or transfer station. There is poured in place rubber surfacing over most of the use zones. Accessible imaginative play houses on rubber tiles provide room for multi-generational play. The playground is surrounded by a concrete walk with different

textures to be used for tricycle safety courses and wheeled access. An accessible, supportive swing is part of the swing apparatus. This swing is on poured in place surfacing. A sand play area with dinosaur fossil is accessible from a transfer platform of precast rocks. The terrace area is shaded by a 20'x20' picnic shelter with 4 accessible tables. Fencing around the playground helps provide a safer environment. The project also included a bike storage shed, multi-sensory butterfly garden, outdoor art court, and a reading garden with stump seats.

Muir Park \$10,000 As part of the renovations of the playground a new accessible walk connects the public sidewalk with the play area. The new equipment includes a train themed accessible structure. Site furniture includes several benches and tables accessible to all.

Site Furniture \$6,000 New accessible furniture was placed along accessible routes to playgrounds and ball fields. The furniture is new to these areas and includes benches and picnic tables for all. Applesced, Hattendorf, Muir, Windemere, Clark and Sanders Parks and the new Park Maintenance center received new furniture.

Sanders Park \$ 3,900 A new concrete walk was installed connecting the public sidewalk with a new bleacher pad and accessible table near the soccer field.

Windermere Park \$2,840 A new accessible concrete walk connects the parking and playground to the spectator area of the soccer field. Accessible spectator space is now available.

Lions Park \$5,240 Accessible path from parking to bleacher areas and players benches. New dugout shelters were installed for shade.

Morton Park \$5,000. The second phase of walk improvements to the park connects the picnic shelter to an accessible bench near Salt Creek. This is the first accessible overlook in the district to Salt Creek. Additional phases will connect to the playground and soccer fields.
